
Les Olympiques des Animaux (The Animals' Olympics)

- **Les Olympiques des Animaux (The Animals' Olympics)** is a theatre production that celebrates the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio, Brazil through live action, comedy, puppets and catchy songs.
- **Lion, Rabbit, Horse, Whale and Elephant**, from five different French speaking countries, participate in an exciting pentathlon, consisting of: **running; cycling; swimming; rowing and long jump.**
- The production uses simple French vocabulary, including numbers, colours, weather, animals and sports etc. An education pack will be available for teachers before the show with songs and activities.
- **Les Olympiques des Animaux** supports the listening and speaking strand of the new KS2 programme of studies as well as the new OFSTED requirement for SMSC provision.
- The show provides a meaningful context for pupils' language learning and will help to develop confidence, teamwork and collaboration.
- The production supports schools applying for International Schools Award, Artsmark and children doing Arts Award.
- **A maximum of 60 children (years 4-6)** will be able to perform in the show after participating in workshops with the actors. The remainder of the children will enjoy the full show as part of the audience.

30 years on from the world's worst nuclear accident...

Where were you when it happened?

What do you or your family remember?

Through documentary film and eye witness testimony, combined with evocative music and movement, Chernobyl@30 travels between the Ukraine and the UK as the consequences of the accident unfold. An invisible cloud of radiation spreads across Europe, falling on people, animals and land.

30 years on, what is the lasting impact of this catastrophe? Countries world-wide are contributing €1.5 billion to build a new cover for the still contaminated reactor. At the same time the exclusion zone has been transformed into one of the largest wildlife areas in Europe. When humans leave, nature takes over...

Chernobyl@30 has been developed through research with writers, scientists, artists and film makers from Ukraine, Canada, Northumberland and Cumbria. It is performed by artists from Ukraine and the UK using physical theatre, film and original music.

An enlightening and ultimately touching story of humanity on the edge of disaster.



French Language Digital Resources for KS2/3

In spring 2014, we launched our e-learning platform at the Association for Language Learning Conference in Lancaster. Our first multi-media programme was *Le Tour de France*, a thrilling seven part adventure story for 7-11 year olds (KS2), based around the world's most famous bicycle race.

We are very pleased to announce that this has been joined by a second digital programme, funded by the Wellcome Trust. *Louis Pasteur and the Devastating Germs* is designed for students in years 8 and 9. Combining science with French language and drama, this programme explores the life and work of 19th century French chemist and microbiologist, Louis Pasteur. There are five chapters within the programme, each featuring a video of key scenes, in French and English,
